Installation of our new Archbishop 10.00 am, 25 March

Bishop Frank Leo of Montreal will be installed as the next Archbishop of Toronto in a special Mass on the Solemnity of the Annunciation: Saturday,

25 March at 10.00 am at St. Michael Cathedral Basilica. Once installed, Archbishop Leo will succeed **Cardinal Thomas Collins**, who has served as Archbishop of Toronto since 2007. Born in 1971, Bishop Leo was ordained a Priest in 1996, and consecrated a Bishop in 2022.

Due to the capacity limit at the Cathedral, participation will be limited to invited guests only. The ceremony will be live-streamed, and plans are also underway for a series of welcome events in the various regions of the Archdiocese of Toronto, allowing the faithful an opportunity to meet the new Archbishop.

The Mass

That the **Mass** is the central feature of the Catholic religion hardly needs to be said. During the Reformation (and always) the Mass has been the test. The word of the Reformers - "It is the Mass that matters" - was true. The long persecution of Catholics in England took the practical form of laws chiefly against saying Mass. For centuries the occupant of the English throne was obliged to manifest his Protestantism, not by a general denial of the whole system of Catholic dogma, but by a formal repudiation of the doctrine of Transubstantiation and of the Mass.

Pope Francis Promotes Family Rosary

Pope Francis has invited "every family, every member of the faithful" to pray the LUMINOUS MYSTERIES of the Rosary on Thursday, 19 March, the Feast of St. Joseph.

At the General Audience on 18 March, the Pope put his support behind the Italian Bishops' call for prayers. He affirmed that he would be praying for and with the country in these trying times. The Pope also invoked the intercession of St. Joseph and the Blessed Mother on the sick and upon all those who take care of them.

Below is a summary of Pope Francis' message.

Dear brothers and sisters,

I unite myself to the moment of prayer that the [Bishops of Italy are] promoting, as a sign of unity for the whole country. In this unprecedented situation, in which everything seems to be crumbling, let us help each other hold fast to what really matters. The Rosary is the prayer of the humble and of the saints. In its mysteries, they contemplate, along with Mary, the life of Jesus, the merciful face of the Father. O, how much we all need to be truly comforted, to be wrapped in loving presence! We pray together, entrusting ourselves to the intercession of St. Joseph, Guardian of the Holy Family.

Prayer to St Joseph

Protect, O Holy Guardian, our nation. Enlighten those responsible for the common good, so that they might know, as you do, how to care for those entrusted to their responsibility. Grant intelligence to those seeking adequate means for the health and physical well-being of their brothers and sisters. Sustain those who are spending themselves for those in need, even at the cost of their own safety: volunteers, nurses, doctors who are on the front lines in curing the sick.


Bless, O St Joseph, the Church: beginning with her ministers, make her the sign and instrument of your light and your goodness.


Accompany, O St Joseph, our families: with your prayerful silence, create harmony between parents and their children, in a special way with the youngest.
