First Holy Communion

Guidelines for 2023

St. Maria Goretti Parish is grateful to be able to celebrate the Sacrament of 1st Holy Communion for the Grade 2 students who have been preparing to receive this Sacrament in Easter Season this year. The Parish has four groups of First Communicants: (a) St. Albert School;
(b) St. Maria Goretti School; (c) Saturday Class for students in other schools; (d) the RCIC.

After three years of pandemic restrictions, it is good to a sense of normalcy in liturgical celebrations. Please read the following.

(1) INSTRUCTION MATERIAL for 1st Communion is provided through the school curriculum, in the Information pages distributed at the January Family Information Nights, and at both of the *Family Instruction meetings* held in March. Each of the Instruction presentations has simple *Scripture* and *Catechism* references, so that Candidates and their families can review and reflect on the material, and use it for prayer and personal preparation for the day of First Holy Communion.

(2) REVIEW It is important that families review the information for this Sacrament. For their convenience, summaries are provided regularly in the website bulletin. For 1st Communion, check the website bulletins for'

(3) ATTIRE *How to dress*? The Archdiocese of Toronto does not have one "mandatory" dress code for all First Communion Candidates. We have a variety of customs in our Parish that reflect the international composition of our faith community. The universal expectation is that, for such an important occasion in their

lives, **Candidates** should wear at least "Sunday best," which is formal or semiformal attire. In addition, it is suggested that the Candidates



incorporate a significant white component to their attire (e.g., a white dress for girls, a white shirt for boys, etc.) as a reminder of their BAPTISM. Boys may wear a suit, or a formal or jacket with complementary semi-formal trousers. Girls may simply wear a white dress, or at least a white blouse. Parents should be mindful that the children's clothing should not be heavy. It is also suggested that Family members and invited friends dress in a respectful and complementary manner, and avoid clothing with garish or bold patterns (stripes, logos, etc.), and wear simple, neutral colours, so that the Candidates stand out during the Mass, and also in the photos taken afterward. In the future, these photos will tell everyone that the focus of the day was on the Candidates and the Holy Sacrament received from the Altar, which Jesus gives as the Food of Life to nourish us through our pilgrimage through this world to the Father's Kingdom.

(4) ARRIVAL Catholic School Candidates should arrive at least 40 minutes prior to their 1st Communion Mass to *Sign In* at an Information Table in the Vestibule, and to find seats with their families *as close as possible to the Sanctuary*. Because of their height, they would not have an appropriate view of the Altar if they are seated towards the back.

(5) Most other GUIDELINES FOR THE LITURGY remain as usual. There is *no photography during Mass* (time for posed photos will be available afterward.) At the time when the Candidates receive their Holy Communion, they approach the Altar with their families.

Confirmation

Guidelines for 2023

Our Parish is grateful to be able to celebrate the **Sacrament of Confirmation** for the Grade 7 students who have been preparing to receive this Sacrament in Easter Season this year. The Parish has four groups of Candidates:

(a) St. Albert School; (b) St. Maria Goretti School; (c) the Saturday Class for students in other schools; (d) the RCIC.

(1) INSTRUCTION MATERIAL for Confirmation is provided through the school curriculum, in the Information pages distributed at the February Family Information Nights, and at all three of the *Student Instructions* held in the schools in March. Each of the Instruction presentations has simple *Scripture* and *Catechism* references, so that Candidates and their families can review and reflect on the material, and use it for prayer and personal preparation for the day of their Confirmation.

(2) REVIEW It is important that families review the information for this Sacrament. For their convenience, summaries are provided regularly in the website bulletin. For Confirmation, check the website bulletins for'

(3) We will resume the use of CONFIRMATION GOWNS, so Candidates will need to cooperate with their teachers, to ensure that their gown, in the correct size, is properly reserved.

(4) ATTIRE *How to dress*? Since we will be resuming the use of the gowns this year, the **Candidates** should simply wear "Sunday best," which is formal or semi-formal attire. They may also incorporate a simple *white component* to their attire (e.g., a white shirt, blouse, dress, etc.) as a reminder of the connection between Confirmation and Baptism. **Family members** and **Sponsors** should avoid clothing with garish

or bold patterns (stripes, logos, etc.), and wear simple, solid neutral colours, so that the Candidates stand out during the Mass. For men: black/grey, navy or khaki tones; for women: black/grey/white, or pastels. In the future, the photos will tell everyone that the focus of the day was on the Candidates and the Sacrament received in front of the Altar, by which the Holy Spirit empowers us to live as faithful disciples of Jeus, our Lord and Saviour.

(5) There will be REHEARSALS to prepare the Candidates to receive this Sacrament in a focused and prayerful manner; they will also need to pay close attention to the directions given during the Mass.

(6) The CONFIRMATION CARD which each Candidate presents to the Pastor at the time they receive the Sacrament, will need to have the chosen **Confirmation Name** printed in large letters on the front.

The Confirmation Name is the Christian *Baptismal* name, or the name of another *Saint* who will serve as a lifelong patron and prayer partner to the newly-confirmed.

(7) Most other GUIDELINES FOR THE LITURGY remain as usual. There is *no photography during Mass* (time for posed photos will be available afterward.) At the time when the Candidates receive their Confirmation, they approach the Altar with their classmates, and the Sponsors stand behind them.

The Liturgy

Confirmation is ordinarily celebrated within the context of the Holy Mass. Following the Proclamation of the Word of God, the Sacrament is administered in this order:

Presentation of the Candidates Homily Renewal of Baptismal Promises Laying On of Hands Anointing with Sacred Chrism



Ecclesiastical Universities in Rome Numbers, History and Courses

Almost 16,000 students, the majority of them men religious, nuns, seminarians and priests, study in one of the 22 Pontifical Institutions that are in the City of Rome and depend on the Vatican. They come from 125 countries.

One of the usual surprises for tourists and pilgrims visiting Rome is to come across nuns, seminarians or priests dressed in the most varied clerical or monastic habits. The visitor usually comes across an unexpected surprise: it seems that in Rome there is not only a surplus of art but also an excess of vocations. At least judging from the quantity of priests and nuns that are on the streets, not only around the Vatican.

Thousands of seminarians, priests, nuns, consecrated lay men and women come to Rome to engage in ecclesiastical studies in one of the Universities, Athenaeums, Pontifical Institutes or Academies that exist in the city.

What Is Taught in the Pontifical Institutions?

The data that follows refers to the academic year 2021-2022. Although Theology is the most offered sacred science in the Universities, 22% of the total, it's not the only one. It is followed by Philosophy, 13%, and Canon Law, 7.4%. In the fourth place are Religious Sciences, 6%. There are also Faculties dedicated to the teaching of more specialized subjects, such as Archaeology, Musicology, Liturgy, Education Sciences, Church History and Mariology.

More specific sectors of specialization are higher formation in the musical realm, Christian Antiquity, Anthropology, Cultural Goods of the Church, Bioethics, Institutional Communication of the Church, Law, Religious Education, Priestly Formation, Leadership and Management, Christian and Classical Literature, Morality, Orientalism, Patristics, Pedagogy, Psychology, Sacred Scripture, Sciences of Marriage and Family, Sciences of Social Communication, Sciences of Peace and International Relations, Social Sciences, Spirituality, Arab and Islamic Studies, Ecumenical Studies, Hebrew Studies and Jewish and Christian Relations, and Inter-Religious Studies.

What Is a Pontifical University, How Many Are There, and How Old Are They?

The 22 Institutions spread throughout Rome (known as "Pontifical Universities") are high level Institutions erected and approved canonically by the Holy See. They depend on it and report directly to it. Despite being on "Italian territory," they are governed by rules of the Vatican.

The oldest University is the Pontifical Gregorian University of the Society of Jesus, erected in 1551; the most recent is the Pontifical Athenaeum Regina Apostolorum, of the Legionaries of Christ, erected in 1993. Between, historically, are the following Universities and Athenaeums:

- 1577 Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas (Angelicum) of the Dominican Fathers
- 1622 Pontifical Urban University
- 1773 Pontifical Lateran University
- 1887 Pontifical Antonianum University
- 1887 Pontifical Athenaeum of Saint Anselm
- 1940 Pontifical Salesian University of the Salesians of Saint John Bosco
- 1984 Pontifical University of the Holy Cross, of the Personal Prelature of the Opus Dei

- 1917 Pontifical Oriental Institute
- 1925 Pontifical Institute of Christian Archaeology

- 1969 Pontifical Patristic Institute Augustinianum
- 1971 Pontifical Institute of Theology of Consecrated Life Claretianum
- 1981 Pontifical John Paul II Theological Institute for the Sciences of Marriage and the Family

The Congregations or Orders that run the Pontifical Institutions in Rome are: the Jesuits, the Legionaries of Christ, the Claretians, the Redemptorists, the Discalced Carmelites, the Franciscans, the Capuchins, the Dominicans, the Servants of Mary, the Benedictines, the Augustinians, the Opus Dei, the Salesians and the White Fathers. The only feminine Congregation with Pontifical Institution are the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians.



March For Life Week Ottawa, 7 - 12 May 2023

The **NATIONAL MARCH FOR LIFE WEEK** is almost here. We need to get the word out about two jam-packed events that are being held exclusively for young pro-lifers. Here's what we have planned.

The "Stand for Life" Youth Banquet and Summit is scheduled for 11 and 12 May. Tickets are still available, but they're going fast, which is no surprise.

The event this year is stacked with some incredible speakers, but it's not just about the talks – it's about the whole experience. And it all kicks off on the evening of 11 May, after the National March, with the annual Youth Banquet, which is the perfect opportunity to dress up and enjoy a great meal together. The Banquet opens with some praise and worship and a performance by Steadfast Worship!, a Toronto-based youth band.

Then, after the music, and when everyone is done eating, Isabel Brown will take the stage. She's this year's keynote speaker and is simply amazing.

Isabel is a best-selling author and a Turning Point USA contributor who creates plenty of pro-life content online. Her passion for the pro-life movement is remarkable.

The next day is the big "Stand for Life" Youth Summit, where we have a roster of pro-life experts from around the world. And everything is rooted in prayer.

That's why the Summit starts off with a special pro-life Mass at the Ottawa Conference and Event Centre, and it will be led by **Fr. Mark Goring**. Steadfast Worship! will be there, too, for some praise and worship music, and there will be a light breakfast. (You can't hold a pro-life summit on an empty stomach, right?)

Autumn Higashi is one of the day's keynote speakers, she's a spokesperson for *Students for Life of America* and host of the UNAPOLOGETIC podcast.

Doctor Calum Miller is the other keynote speaker, he's a bioethicist and research associate for the University of Oxford. He also happens to be a rising star in the global pro-life movement.

On top of all that, our youth coordinators are planning a fullslate of breakout sessions throughout the day, with talks from **Angelique Clark**, the founder of the pro-life apparel line, LIFE DRESS; **Dr. Haywood Robinson**, a former abortionist who works at 40 DAYS FOR LIFE now, and **Dr. Monique Ruberu**, an OB-GYN and fertility specialist.

Our very own **Josie Luetke** will be there, too! She really knows her stuff, and there might be a chance to pick her brain about some pro-life apologetics.

The "Stand for Life" Youth Banquet and Summit is ideally for pro-lifers between the ages of 13-29.

Our theme for the **2023 National March for Life** is "STAND FIRM." This is a call to be strong for those who are weak. The violence of abortion and euthanasia will be met with the gospel of peace. We recognize that we fight not against abortionists and "doctors" who kill their patients, nor against death-pushing activists, nor Godless politicians; we lovingly fight for them—for their conversion. We fight for lives. We fight for souls.
