On CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY, all Masses will conclude with *Benediction*.


In the morning, the Blessed Sacrament will remain on the Altar for *Adoration*:

Relic of St. Anthony of Padua in St. Aidan Church on 14 June

13 June is the Feast of **St. Anthony of Padua**. St. Aidan Church will have a Mass Tuesday evening at 7:30 pm, and the following day, Wednesday 14 June, the relic of St. Anthony will be in the Church for veneration. There will be a Mass at 9:00 am as well as an evening Mass at 7:30 pm.

St. Anthony of Padua, (Italian: Sant'Antonio da Padova: original name, Fernando Martins de Bulhões) was born in 1195 in Lisbon, Portugal, and died 13 June 1231 in Arcella, Verona, Italy. He was canonized in 1232. He served as a Franciscan friar, Doctor of the Church, and patron of the poor. Padua and Portugal both claim him as their Patron Saint, and he is invoked for the return of lost property.

Anthony was born into a wealthy family and was raised in the Church. He joined the Augustinians in 1210 and became a Priest. In 1220 he joined the Franciscan order, hoping to preach to the Muslims and be martyred. On his way to Morocco, he became seriously ill and was forced to return home. However, his ship back to Portugal was blown off course and eventually landed in Sicily. Because of his continuing poor health, he was not allowed to pursue his missionary work among the Muslims. Instead, he taught theology at Bologna, Italy, and at Montpellier, Toulouse, and Puy-en-Velay in southern France. He won great acclaim as a preacher and was noted for his simple yet profound teaching of the Catholic faith. He died en route to Padua, Italy, where he is buried.

The Road Less Travelled

In 2022, Mark Nestor, a young Irish politician quit his seat on Clare County Council to enter the Seminary.

He was a rising star of the Irish political scene. When he was elected for the Irish *Fianna Fail* party in 2019, he was Clare County Council's youngest member. It was his first time contesting a seat. He was due to become Mayor of Ennis town in the West of Ireland last year, but to the surprise of many, he declined the post. Then the 30-year-old created an even greater stir when he resigned his Council seat and announced he was beginning his studies for the Priesthood. Becoming a Priest today, he was on "the road less travelled."

Mark Nestor's decision to pursue his vocation comes as the Church in Ireland faces huge challenges amid a decline in the number of diocesan Priests. Recent research by the Association of Catholic Priests in Ireland revealed that a quarter of all diocesan Priests currently serving in the Irish Church expected to retire over the next 15 years. The survey also showed that across all 26 Irish dioceses,52 Priests or fewer than 2.5 percent of working Priests are younger than 40, and there are just 47 seminarians studying for all dioceses at the national seminary in Maynooth. Mark Nestor did an interview with the *Messenger of Saint Anthony*.

When Mark Nestor announced he was leaving politics to begin studying for the Priesthood, his political colleagues paid tribute to him personally, praised his decision and gave him a standing ovation in the Council chamber.

The members of Fianna Fail in Ennis wrote, "Now that the news is officially out, we at *Ennis Comhairle Ceantair* would like to extend our congratulations to Mark Nestor as he leaves the political field for a vocation of a very different kind. We wish Mark the very best in the future. Though he will be missed in the town, he is gentleman who will bring youth, enthusiasm and a great work ethic into his vocation."

Councillor Mary Howard of *Fine Gael* said Mark Nestor was following his dreams and his heart in pursuing his ambition to become a Priest. She confessed that she started crying when he first informed her of his decision. "My first reaction was to start crying because I was delighted for him, but sad for us. Today is a sad day for us, but a happy day for Mark. You are following your heart and your dreams. Mark is a man of great integrity and really loves his town and his family. Please God in seven years' time, you might officiate as a Priest at our Mass here in the foyer for Clare County Council staff. Be very proud that you have made a very, very difficult decision and you have done it".

Independent Councillor Ann Norton, a former Mayor of Ennis town, praised what she described as Mark's difficult decision' to leave his work as a Councillor and begin his studies to become a Priest. She expressed the wish that he would return in the future and officiate at weddings diocese of Killaloe, and she said Mark Nestor had "the temperament to become a Priest. A wonderful Priest."



Ennis mayor Councillor Clare Colleran Molly of Fianna Fail said, "You are a conscientious, serious, contemplative young man.... It is the right way for you to go and you are 100 percent certain of it"; while the Mayor of Clare, Councillor Tony O'Brien told Mark Nestor, "What you are doing is a very brave and courageous move. You are a person and a man to be admired and respected." Summing up how everyone felt, Clare Council chief executive, Pat Dowling said, "It is a long journey. It is a big step from Councillor to riesthood and from politics to piety at such a young age."
