Liturgy Notes

Ukrainian Christmas is now 25 December

The Ukrainian Parliament has moved the date of



Christmas. The NATIVITY OF CHRIST will be celebrated in Ukraine on December 25, instead of January 7. The relevant amendments were introduced in Article 73 of the Labor Code of Ukraine.

Earlier this year, the UGCC (Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church) in Ukraine announced the transition to a new style for fixed holidays starting 1 September 2023. Following this, the decision to switch to the new calendar was adopted by the UGCC in Kazakhstan and Central Asia, Germany and Scandinavia, Australia and Oceania, Poland, and the Eparchy of the Holy Family in London.

The date is now harmonized with the Roman Catholic Church. It will also be followed by the Ukrainian Orthodox. This distances Ukraine from the calendar of the Russian Orthodox Church.

World Youth Day 2023

A Pilgrim's Reflections



Michelle Pacheco, Mission Development Coordinator for *OCY Missionaries* at the Office of Catholic Youth, was one of the more than 5,000 Canadian pilgrims who journeyed to Lisbon, Portugal, to celebrate World Youth Day in August. Below, she reflects on the experience of celebrating her Catholic faith among 1.5 million international pilgrims

1. What were the highlights of your WYD experience?

One highlight was the opportunity for *Adoration*. In all the busyness, the chance for quiet prayer was consoling and strengthening. This was especially profound at the overnight Vigil, where I was struck by the stillness as 1.5 million people were adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. And I had the chance to venerate the relics of **Pope St. John Paul II, Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati**, and **St. Therese of Lisieux**.

2. How did this year's theme come to life for you?

Pope Francis' addresses and homilies brought to life how Mary is our model in responding to God's love and grace. When we look at the Annunciation and the Visitation, with the theme scripture, Mary arose and went with haste, right between the two stories, we see that Mary has a powerful experience of "being loved by God and called by name." Then, she must "embrace the risk of loving" as she says yes to "welcoming the Redeemer of the world." She goes to Elizabeth because authentic love and "joy is missionary" or, in other words, "it is to be shared with others." Finally, when Mary encounters Elizabeth, she "radiates light" since she has "welcomed Jesus into her heart and has learned to love as He does." I've never reflected so deeply on this movement of grace that Mary experiences and how I can learn from it.

3. What impact did World Youth Day have on your faith, and how will you share this in your faith life at home?

Prior to World Youth Day, I asked God for the grace to be confident in His love for me and He answered in many surprising ways. While on a walking pilgrimage, I was so physically and emotionally exhausted that I was falling asleep in prayer and struggling to begin conversations with other pilgrims. I had nothing to offer God or others, and this frustrated me. In this experience, God reminded me that I am loved, and there is nothing I can do to earn His love. Pope Francis echoed this point in his first address when he said that "Jesus calls me as I am, not as I would like to be." Now that I am home, I want to remember this experience and let myself be grounded in the truth that I am loved as I am.

Orthodox – Catholic Theological Consultation

at St. Augustine Seminary, Scarborough

The *North American Orthodox-Catholic Theological Consultation* met on 16-18 May 2023 at St. Augustine Seminary of Toronto. The 101st meeting was hosted by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops.

In addition to those who came together in person, six members joined virtually. In the course of the meeting, the Consultation completed a joint statement on the theology and practice of marriage in both of our Churches. The Consultation resolved its discussions on the topic of "Orthodox-Catholic Marriages" and completed the document for ultimate publication.

His Eminence **Cardinal Joseph Tobin**, N.J., Catholic co-chair of the Consultation stated, "this meeting was important in many ways and marks a turning point in the Consultation's future. I am convinced that this new document on marriage offers compassionate and specific pastoral recommendations for the care and spiritual growth of Catholic-Orthodox families."

Additionally, the Consultation, building on the success of the past fifty-eight years, finalized a restructuring proposal to work well moving forward.

About the restructuring of the Consultation, His Eminence **Metropolitan Methodios**, Orthodox cochair commented that "the new form envisioned for the future work of the Consultation will offer more flexibility and a renewed commitment to reconciliation between Orthodox and Catholics."

Both the Document, entitled "The Pastoral Care of Mixed Marriages: Neither Yours nor Mine, but Ours," and the Restructuring Proposal were sent to the USCCB/CCCB (the national conferences of Catholic Bishops for the U.S. and Canada) and the ASSEMBLY OF CANONICAL ORTHODOX BISHOPS of the U.S.A. for their review and publication.
