



The Princess becomes a Queen



Queen Elizabeth II was the head of the English royal family for 70 years, making her the longestreigning monarch ever. She died at the age of 96 at Balmoral Castle, Scotland, on 8 Sept. 2022. Here's a look at the time she ascended to the throne, as her own

son King Charles III did after her passing.

She fell into the position at just 25 years old in 1952 after her father, King George VI, died of coronary thrombosis at 56 amid his battle with lung cancer. Elizabeth was not officially crowned until June 2, 1953, but she was asked to lead the minute the King died.

Despite being overcome with grief when he was laid to rest, the royal family was aware of the King's declining health and knew that Elizabeth's time was coming. The King was forced to postpone a tour of New Zealand and Australia because of his condition. What's more, he suffered an arterial blockage in 1949 and had to have his left lung removed in the summer of 1951.

George had been showing his daughter state papers. There were black clothes in Elizabeth's suitcase when she traveled. She was prepared, though it's not certain she was ever really ready for what was ahead.

The Princess's Trip to Kenya

On February, 6, 1952, the day George VI died at Sandringham House, Elizabeth wasn't by her father's side. Instead, she was working on his behalf. At the time, the British monarchy was under intense scrutiny in Kenya. *Mau Mau* fighters were gaining power in their fight for independence (which they eventually won in 1963). Though the safety of the royal family was a big concern among British officials, the King felt it was necessary to show face on the African continent.

Knowing that the King was too ill to travel, Elizabeth set off on the Commonwealth tour with her husband, the Duke of Edinburgh (who later became Prince Philip in 1957). Little did Elizabeth know that when she departed Heathrow on January 31, 1952 that it would be the last time she would ever see her beloved father.

The royal couple arrived in Kenya on 1 February. They greeted the Governor and then enjoyed time at the Treetops Hotel, located in the heart of the forest. Five days later, King George VI took his final breath.



According to Robert Lacy, author of *The Queen: A Life in Brief*, she reacted stoically, and showed almost no distress. "She was sitting erect, fully accepting her destiny," Martin Charteris, the princess's private secretary, says in the book. No one actually saw Elizabeth shed a tear. It is said that as Elizabeth departed the lodge, no photographers took a single shot of the historic moment, per Her Majesty's request.

Accepting Her New Position

On February 7, after a storm delayed her departure, Elizabeth arrived in London. The mood was somber, as the whole nation mourned the death of their sovereign. Flags were at half-mast, many businesses were shut down and sporting events were canceled. Prime Minister Winston Churchill had already addressed the nation in a broadcast.

The next day, privy counselors and Commonwealth delegates attended an Accession Council at St. James's Palace, where Elizabeth officially accepted her new role.

Season of Creation

1 September – 4 October 2024

"To hope and act with God's Creation"

The Season of Creation challenges the entire global Christian family to care for God's creation through prayer and action. **Pope Francis** in his message for the 'World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation' this year stresses that Christians are called to live in faith and charity, caring for the environment is "a task to be undertaken freely, in obedience to Jesus' commandment of love."

At its origins, the SEASON OF CREATION began with **Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I** announcing a 'Day of Prayer for Creation' for the Orthodox Church on September 1, 1989 and many major European churches followed, embracing it as part of their calendar in 2001.

In the encyclical "Laudato Si" (2015) on Care for our Common Home, **Pope Francis** called the Catholic Church to observe the 'World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation.'

This season begins on September 1 (the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation) and ends on October 4 (the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, patron saint of ecology).

An annual theme for the SEASON OF CREATION is chosen by an ecumenical steering committee. For 2024, the theme is "To hope and act with Creation" and the symbol is "The first fruits of hope," inspired by Romans 8:19-25.

Like the *Week of Prayer for Christian Unity*, the *Season of Creation* may be observed with flexibility and resources may be adapted to local situations.

Here are some Intercessions we will be using on the five Sundays during the SEASON OF CREATION in the Prayer of the Faithful at Mass.

- That we may receive the grace to respect and care for God's creation. We pray to the Lord.
- God of the land, the sea, the sky: Open our hearts to the rhythm of Creation in the swells of the ocean, the movements of air and wind, the breath of all living things. We pray to the Lord.
- God of Light, Life and Love: Help us understand the roots of the ecological crisis and give us wisdom to live resiliently in harmony with your Creation. We pray to the Lord.
- God of truth and justice: Guide us in paths of righteousness that help us to tread softly on the land and sail gently on the sea. We pray to the Lord.
- God of hope: Help us to trust that your reign of love is manifested in our common love- for you, for ourselves, for our neighbour and for your creation. We pray to the Lord.
- May St. Francis' love for all creatures be reflected in our care for the environment. May we revere God's handiwork in the world which surrounds us. We pray to the Lord.
