RCIA: Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* (RCIA) is the process by which adults become Catholic. It is a journey of faith which take place in the midst of a Parish, the worshiping community.

While each person's journey is unique, the group process involves three initial stages:

- 1. The interested person is invited to pray sincerely, and to join us at **Mass** for worship, to discern where God is leading them.
- 2. Then begins a period of **Inquiry**, when the Candidate is invited to join the weekly RCIA meetings. A Sponsor will be delegated to assist with one-on-one discernment.
- 3. After a suitable period of Inquiry, the Candidate is invited to enter into the **Catechumenate**, which is a more structured period of preparation involving group study, discussion, reflection and participation in parish life.

Stewardship: 2025 Sunday Envelopes

Parishioners are invited to pick up their *Sunday Offertory Envelopes* in the Vestibule after Mass. The envelopes are for registered parishioners only; if you are new to the neighbourhood and have not yet registered, *welcome!* Introduce yourself to the pastor or to one of our greeters, and fill out a *registration form* at the Office window.

Many thanks to all our faithful parishioners for your generous support of our wonderful parish through your weekly stewardship! This is an act of honour to God, our Creator.

Please ensure that you have your own box: *the number on the label and on the envelopes* must be the same. If there is any discrepancy, advise the parish office. If you use someone else's envelopes, your donation would be credited to the other person.

Donation amounts

For new parishioners: Please ensure that your *donation amount* is written in the space provided on the front of the envelope. If this is not done, our financial advisors must stop to do so when the collection is counted, and this really slows down the process.

Make sure to use your tax receipts

The government rarely gives any tax dollars back, except for charitable donations. Everyone gets a credit of 17% on the first \$200.00 donated and 29% on any amount over that. Here's an example: if you give \$10.00 a week to the church (which means \$520.00 per year) you will wind up with a tax credit of \$128.80! So, if you are not using the envelopes, you are not taking advantage of the tax break our government is offering. To get your own envelopes, and an official tax receipt next year, fill in the form in the front of this bulletin and give it to an usher.

Cardinal Leo, Elevated on 7 December 2024

On 7 December 2024, Archbishop Francis Leo entered a Papal Consistory at the Vatican that welcomed 21 leaders of the Catholic Church into the College of Cardinals. Now addressed as "**His Eminence, Francis Cardinal Leo**," he has deeply contemplated the prayers of the ceremony.

"What does it mean?" he pondered during a joint interview with THE CATHOLIC REGISTER and SALT + LIGHT TV at the Canadian Pontifical College on 9 December. "It's a ritual, a liturgy, but what's its significance? The deep significance in the life of the Church and the witnessing of the Church in the world today. All of these thoughts came together, and interiorly renewing my own faith and my commitment to Christ and the Holy Mother Church to serve faithfully."

The inspiration of Mother Mary was knitted close to the 53-year-old Montreal native's heart during this weekend of both elevation and humility. A devout Marian with a degree in Mariology from the University of Dayton (he also cofounded the Canadian Mariological Society), Leo treasured the gift of his first Mass as cardinal-archbishop occurring on the Dec. 8 Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

"It's God saying, 'I'm here and I'm here for you, I love you and I'm guiding you,' " said Leo. "I see her presence very strongly this week. Indications here and there of the gift that she is and her maternal care for me and the Church."

Leo also felt the prayers of both the hundreds of pilgrims who accompanied him to Rome and his supporters back home in Canada. He also drew strength from being in Rome.

"We're sharing the same faith with the apostles of Christ," said Leo. "That is very touching. In the continuity of 2,000 years of the Church, of the Holy Spirit who is the soul of the Church enacted in the Church."

Looking forward, Leo's advancement into the cardinalate will be celebrated in Toronto, commencing with a special invite-only Mass at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica on Jan. 15. In late January and throughout February, liturgies and receptions will be held in the western, northern, central and eastern regions of the archdiocese.

The new Cardinal will also guide his flock throughout the **2025 Jubilee** declared by Pope Francis. He anticipates that "the Lord wants to pour out generously into our hearts many graces: graces of conversion, graces that will deepen our faith, and graces of prayer, healing and liberation."

Leo will inaugurate the year-long celebrations with a 5 pm Mass at St. Michael, 29 Dec. Many archdiocesan committees are planning a series of activities and celebrations at designated parishes. The Cardinal expressed his hope that the slate of festivities being devised will inspire Catholics to "rediscover the beauty of the sacrament of forgiveness."
