It is now three years since the following letter was received by our Catholic Women's League.

9 June 2019

To: **Eden Geonzon**, *President*, Catholic Women's League, St. Maria Goretti Parish

Dear Eden,

I have some great news to share with you. I am now able to confirm that **Asia Bibi** has finally left Pakistan and is now safe and sound right here in Canada!

Praise God that after nine long years, this cruel and unjust ordeal has finally come to an end. Asia is now free to begin a new life in peace and safety among us.

As you may recall, Asia Bibi was arrested and charged with blaspheming the false prophet Mohammed after talking about Christ with her co-workers. She was found guilty and put on death row.

After languishing in prison since 2009, her appeal went through to the Supreme Court of Pakistan. On 31 October 2018, the Court overturned Asia Bibi's death sentence and acquitted her of all charges, *ordering her immediate release*.

However, the Supreme Court's verdict inflamed the anger of radical Muslims in Pakistan. Violent protests erupted and spread all over the country, with thousands demanding that Asia Bibi be hanged. Asia's life and freedom were once again in jeopardy.

After her case was formally reviewed, Asia was vindicated a second time. Then, months later, after being sequestered in a secret safe house in Pakistan, she was finally allowed to leave the country and obtain asylum here in Canada.

We at CitizenGO worked to petition the Pakistani government and draw attention to her plight over many years. Hundreds of thousands of CitizenGO ers like you signed to show your support for Asia. Our efforts also included **rallies and prayer vigils** all over the world. We even ran **full- and half-page ads** in leading international newspapers, including the Toronto Star and National Post. In addition, we raised **thousands of dollars of aid** to help Asia and her family.

It was a very long and difficult road to travel for Asia – an exceedingly heavy cross for her and her family to bear.But now, at long last, by God's grace, **she is truly free!**

This is a victory we need to celebrate and share with others!

I want to thank you, our CitizenGO family, for all your prayers and financial support over the years in the cause of Asia Bibi. I also want to thank you for signing our petitions in her defence. Finally, I want to say a special thanks to those dozen souls who braved the cold and sleet to stand with me in front of the Pakistani Consulate in Toronto last fall (see below).

God has blessed all of your efforts, all of your prayers, and all of your sacrifice!

Due to the need to keep Asia Bibi safe as she starts her new life in Canada, we are unable to report on her new location or provide any other details at this time. All we can tell you

is that she has been relocated somewhere in Western Canada.

Once again, thank you and God bless you for your support!

Queen Elizabeth II: Platinum Jubilee

The Queen has said she was :humbled and deeply touched: by the Platinum Jubilee celebrations held across the UK. In a :thank you: letter after a concluding pageant in London, she said she remained committed to serving as monarch with the support of her family. The Queen said despite not being at every event marking her 70-year reign: :My heart has been with you all. She was joined by three generations of her family on the Buckingham Palace balcony for the finale of the pageant. Her appearance rounded off a huge star-studded procession along The Mall which saw carnival floats celebrating the seven decades of her reign.

In a statement issued as the long weekend's events drew to a close, the Queen, who is 96, said she had been inspired by the kindness, joy and kinship she had seen over during the four-day celebration.

It said: :When it comes to how to mark 70 years as your Queen, there is no guidebook to follow. It really is a first. But I have been humbled and deeply touched that so many people have taken to the streets to celebrate my Platinum Jubilee.

:While I may not have attended every event in person, my heart has been with you all; and I remain committed to serving you to the best of my ability, supported by my family.

I have been inspired by the kindness, joy and kinship that has been so evident in recent days, and I hope this renewed sense of togetherness will be felt for many years to come.



The Pope's ambitious six-day visit to Africa, 2 – 7 July

Despite having to use a wheelchair, Pope Francis is going ahead with his July 2-7 visit to the Democratic Republic of Congo and South Sudan. Pope Francis has been physically weakened and slowed down by knee pain. The Vatican has confirmed that the July trip is going forward, despite rumors of its postponement. The 85-year-old Pope, who has been mostly confined to a wheelchair the past few weeks, will travel 7 ½ -hours by plane on Saturday, 2 July, to the DRC capital, Kinshasa. He will be taken immediately to the Palais de la Nation to meet President Felix Tshisekedi. The DRC leader, who was elected in December 2018, first met the Pope in January 2020 during a visit to the Vatican. After his visit to DRC, he will proceed to South Sudan.

Prior to 2011, South Sudan, which is largely Christian, was part of Sudan, to the north, which is largely Muslim and Arab. South Sudan's capital is Juba.



21 New Cardinals

Pope Francis announced on 29 May that he will create 21 new cardinals, at a consistory on 27 August. The Pope made the announcement from a window overlooking St. Peter Square after reciting the *Regina Caeli*. This is the list:

Arthur Roche, prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments (UK). Lazzaro You Heung-sik, Prefect for the Congregation for Clergy (South Korea).

Fernando Vergez Alzaga, President of the Pontifical Commission for Vatican City State (Spain).

Archbishop Jean-Marc Aveline, of Marseille (France).

Archbishop Peter Okpaleke, of Ekwulobia (Nigeria).

Archbishop Leonardo Ulrich Steiner, of Manaus (Brazil).

Archbishop Filipe Neri António Sebastião of Goa (India).

Bishop Robert Walter McElroy, of San Diego (US)

Archbishop Virgilio Da Silva, of Dili (East Timor).

Bishop Oscar Cantoni, of Como (Italy).

Archbishop Anthony Poola, of Hyderabad (India).

Archbishop Paulo Cezar Costa, of Brasília (Brazil).

Bishop Richard Kuuia Baawobr M. Afr, of Wa (Ghana).

Five of the new Cardinals will be over the age of 80: Archbishop Jorge Enrique Jiménez Carvajal, Archbishop Emeritus of Cartagena (Colombia).

Archbishop Adalberto Martínez, of Asunción (Paraguay).

Archbishop Giorgio Marengo, of Ulaanbaatar (Mongolia).

Archbishop William Goh Seng Chye (Singapore).

Archbishop Lucas Van Looy, sdb, of Ghent (Belgium). Archbishop Arrigo Miglio, Archbishop of Cagliari (Italy). Father Gianfranco Ghirlanda sj (Italy). Monsignor Fortunato Frezza (Italy).

Since his election in 2013, Pope Francis has created 101 Cardinals from 58 countries at seven consistories. The last consistory to create new cardinals took place on 28 Nov. 2020. Then, the new Cardinals included Cardinal Wilton Gregory of Washington and Cardinal Raniero Cantalamessa, the Preacher to the Papal Household since 1980. Following the 2020 consistory, 73 of the Cardinals eligible to vote a future conclave had been appointed by Pope Francis; 39 had been appointed . Benedict XVI, and 16 had been appointed by St. John Paul II. Ahead of the upcoming consistory, there are currently 117 Cardinals, 67 (52%) of whom have been appointed by Pope Francis.
