The *training meetings* are held at 9.00 am on Saturdays for our Altar Server Candidates.





The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults has been in use in Canada since 1974.

Liturgy Notes 17 March: St. Patrick Day

St. Patrick of Ireland was born at Kilpatrick, near Dumbarton, in Scotland, in the year 387; he died at Downpatrick, Ireland, 17 March, 461. As a boy of fourteen, he was kidnapped and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd sheep. He escaped, but had a dream in which the people of Ireland were begging him to come back. He was ordained a Priest and later a bishop, and was sent to Ireland on 25 March 433. He converted all of Ireland, using a shamrock to explain the Trinity.





19 March: St. Joseph Day

Everything we know about the husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus comes from Scripture. He was a carpenter, a working man (Matthew 13.55). We know Joseph was a man of faith, obedient to whatever God asked of him without knowing the outcome. We know he loved Jesus. His one concern was for the safety of this child entrusted to him. We also know that he treated Jesus as his own son for the people of Nazareth say of Jesus, "Is this not the son of Joseph?" (Luke 4.22)

Candidates for 1st Communion, Confirmation: The Sunday Mass Slips

The Candidates submit their SUNDAY MASS SLIPS, which represent their wish to join the prayer action of all parishioners. After the *Intercessions*, the Candidates bring their completed slips and gather near the Offertory Gift table at the head of the main aisle, and form a line behind the pews. Candidates walk behind the Gift Bearers when they are led by the Servers to the Altar. The Candidates place their slips in the basket held by the Priest.

4th Sunday of Lent: LAETARE

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called *Laetare* Sunday. It gets its name from the first word (in Latin) of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her." *Laetare* Sunday is a chance for us to pause and remember the whole point of Lent, said beautifully in the Prayer over the People where God is asked to "give life by your unfailing light to those who walk in the shadow of death, and bring those rescued by your mercy from every evil to reach the highest good."


By this Sunday we are well into Lent and sometimes we might lose the forest through the trees. We might forget that we know the end of the story. Yes, there is suffering, yes there is death, but we can rejoice in the fact that death does not have the last word. "Be joyful" the Entrance Antiphon continues, "all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast."

We rejoice because Easter is almost here. We rejoice because our Salvation has been won for us. Yes, we still have more Lent, yes Good Friday is coming, but for this one Sunday, in a special way, we rejoice and remember that the battle is already won.
