National March for Life 10 May

The *National March for Life* in Ottawa, the largest annual protest on Parliament Hill, has been set for 10 May 2018, and the theme for this year's march is 'PRO-LIFE ALL IN.'

Pro-lifers will gather on Parliament Hill to demand that our laws once again uphold the right to life which is inherent to every human being. The March for Life is the largest annual demonstration on Parliament Hill, and a sign that ending abortion is the civil rights movement of our day.

The *National March For Life* is organized by Campaign Life Coalition, the political arm of the pro-life movement. The event is a forum for pro-life Canadians to demand social justice for the more than 100,000 children who are killed in their mother's womb each year across Canada. Abortion is fully funded by taxpayers for any reason or no reason at all, right up to the moment of birth.

The *National March For Life* began in 1998 with a mere 700 pro-lifers in attendance. At first, there was a bit of support for the March from political, cultural and spiritual leaders, but as the event grew, they started coming. Every year the event has grown dramatically. In 2015, a record-smashing 25,000 were in attendance. It is a very young pro-life crowd, with 80% of the marchers under the age of 30.

Each year, numerous pro-life Members of Parliament, Senators, activists and religious leaders give speeches from the steps of Parliament Hill in defense of the right to life.

Afterwards, the throng of pro-life Canadians begin to march through the streets of Ottawa. They are led by the Ottawa police who keep the route safe and clear.

When the March ends, people re-assemble on the lawn of Parliament Hill and listen to moving post-abortion testimonies by the *Silent No More Awareness Campaign*, which is then followed by a prayer service.

Proud to be Canadian

After digging to a depth of 5 meters last year, British scientists found traces of copper wire 160 years old. They came to the conclusion that their ancestors already had a telephone network more than 150 years ago.

Pilgrimage to Mexico

15 -21 November 2018

Nov. 15 - Thursday

Arrive in Mexico City, and transfer to the “City of Angels,” Puebla, for Mass and dinner.

Nov. 16 - Friday

The Old City, Cathedral, Dominican Cloister, Rosary Chapel. Tlaxcala and the Shrine of San Miguel del Milagro. Mass where St. Michael the Archangel appeared to Diego Lazaro in 1631, directing him to the Grotto and to a well of miraculous waters. See the image of Our Lady of Ocotlan in the Basilica of Our Lady.

Nov. 17 - Saturday

The Indian baroque Church of Tanantzintla and Cholula Church constructed on top of the Great Pyramid. Then to the famous “Silver City,” Taxco. See jewels of baroque style architecture – St. Priscilla and St. Sebastian Church.

Nov. 18 - Sunday

Depart to Mexico City. Visit the Square of the Three Cultures, and continue to the old and new Basilicas of Our Lady of Guadalupe, visited by several million pilgrims every year. The site is near the location where Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared to Juan Diego in 1531.

Nov. 19 - Monday

Explore the magnificent city centre, built over the ruins of the Aztec capital city. Stop at the Zocalo, Palacio Nacional, celebrate Mass in the Cathedral and drive along the famous Paseo de la Reforma.

Nov. 20 - Tuesday

Travel to Teotihuacan and the largest American Pyramids, the pyramids of the Sun and the Moon. Also see the Pyramid of the “Feathered Dragon.”

Nov. 21 - Wednesday

Farewell Mass at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, and transfer to airport.
