Princess Alexandra Becomes Catholic

Princess Alexandra of Hanover, a member of the royal family of Monaco, has been removed from her place in the British line of succession after having become a Catholic.

The news was reported in English on 27 Sept. by *Royal Central*, which cited *Point de Vue*, a French weekly.

Because the British monarch is head of the Church of England, which is the established church, British law bars Catholics from succeeding to the throne.

The Succession to the Crown Act 2013 allowed heirs to the throne to marry Catholics, among other changes. However, the law still stipulates that the acting British sovereign cannot be Catholic, since they have been barred from the English throne since the Act of Settlement, 1701.

Princess Alexandra, 19, was born in Austria and was baptized Lutheran. She is the daughter of Caroline, Princess of Hanover (who has always been Catholic) and Prince Ernst August of Hanover. Through her father she is descended from Victoria, daughter of Queen Victoria.

Alexandra is the granddaughter of Grace Kelly, who in 1956 became Princess of Monaco when she married Prince Rainier III. So in addition to having been in the British line, Alexandra is 12th in line to the throne of Monaco She is a figure skater, and has represented Monaco internationally.

Along with Alexandra, **Lord Nicholas Windsor** has also been excluded from the British line of succession for becoming Catholic. Lord Nicholas is a great-grandson of George V, and was baptized in the Church of England. He was received into the Catholic Church in 2001.

The Pumpkin


A woman was asked by a coworker, "What is it like to be a Christian?"
