The Divine Mercy Message

The Divine Mercy message is simple. It is that God loves us - all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. All can come to share His joy.

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

A - Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

B - Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.

C - Completely trust in Jesus. The graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

This message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of **Saint Faustina Kowalska**, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.

The message and devotional practices proposed in the *Diary of Saint Faustina* are completely in accordance with the teachings of Church and are firmly rooted in the Gospel message of our Merciful Savior. Properly understood and implemented, they will help us grow as genuine followers of Christ.

Spend time to learn more about the mercy of God, learn to trust in Jesus, and live your life as merciful disciples.





Our Lady of Good Health

Our Lady of Good Health Tamil Catholic Parish celebrated its parish feast in Scarborough on 9 September 2018 with a special Mass and a grand outside procession.

This feast has been celebrated every year. However, this was a very special year with a new parish priest, and all the parishioners came together to make it a grand success. The Church was packed. The procession went along Birchmount Road, Kingston Road and then around the Church. The procession followed the sidewalk and did not interfere with the traffic on the streets. The statue of Mother Mary was carried with prayers and songs.

Mass at 4:30 pm was heavily attended. The Church decor echoed the colours of the vestments, reminding parishioners of the sacrifice that the Cross represents. A combined choir brought together musicians from our various Masses to enhance the celebration with their powerful singing and playing.

Rev. **Joseph Jebaratnam**, the vicar general of the Jaffna Diocese in Sri Lanka, was the main celebrant, together with many other priests. Rev. **Charles Collins**, the newly appointed parish priest for the Tamil Catholics in the Greater Toronto Area, organized the celebration with great enthusiasm and spirit.

After Mass, parishioners joined the procession around the Church with the Knights of Columbus. At the end of the celebration, snacks and light food were served outside the church.

Rev. Collins was installed as pastor of Our Lady of Good Health Tamil Parish on 16 September. Most Rev. **Vincent Nguyen**, the Bishop of Toronto for the Eastern Region, officially installed him.

The Tamil Parish functions at the Church of Immaculate Heart of Mary, located at Birchmount and Danforth Avenue. Rev. **Peter Tammearu** welcomed us and continued to cater to the needs of the English parishioners in the parish.

Attendance at the Parent-Godparent meeting follows an individual interview with a Priest or Deacon, at which time any personal questions may be discussed. In a multicultural Parish, there may be a variety of expectations about the role of Godparents, and who is eligible; the length of the ceremony, to plan private celebrations to follow; and other issues arising from different traditions.

The basic concern of the Church is that Parents and Godparents are united in their commitment to raise the child as a member of the Body of Christ, the Catholic Church; and to ensure that all attending the Sacrament are prepared to do so in a joyful and prayerful manner.
