


Saturday Catechism

Pick up your own box

Ensure that you have your own box: the number on the label and on the envelopes must be identical. If you notice any discrepancy, advise the parish office right away. If you use someone else's envelopes, your donation would be credited to the other person.

Donation amounts

Some new parishioners have missed the instruction to ensure that the *donation amount* should be written in the space provided on the front of the envelope. If this is not done, our financial advisors must stop to do so when the collection is counted, and this really slows down the process.

Kindly wait until 1 January 2020 to begin using your new envelopes. If you misplaced your box for the current year, visit the Office after any Sunday morning Mass and we will look after you.

As we continue to live in the spirit of our Thanksgiving celebration with our families, let us give thanks for the teachers, trustees and sports





November Liturgical Notes Prayers for the Faithful Departed



The Liturgical tradition of the Church provides constant reminders to pray for our beloved dead. Funerals are conducted as *Requiem Masses* and the Priest wears black or white vestments. Most daily Masses are offered for the deceased, and Sunday Intercessions include clear and updates prayers for the dead.

We cherish these reminders to pray for the dead. Even funeral Masses are celebrated with an emphasis on the Resurrection. This gives a focus to our prayers.

This is exactly what the Church teaches: to remember, with love. The Church continues to encourage us to pray for the dead. The CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH states clearly:

"Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them."

The Catechism then gives the reason for saying this:

"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven."

We can't know for certain if our beloved dead still need our prayers; but if they do, how ungrateful we would be if we neglected to help with our prayers and Masses.

The month of November gives us an opportunity to pray more earnestly for them.

All Souls Day is a time to remember with gratitude both the dead, as well as the living who are near and dear to us, and to thank God for them.

We owe much to those who have gone before us. We would be most ungrateful if we did not remember them in our prayer and masses.

We are also deeply indebted to good friends like you who share in our mission efforts and make our work as missionaries possible.

That is why we make this month of grateful remembrance an occasion to offer special prayers for all the members of our parish family, living and deceased.

St. Cecilia, Patroness of Musicians Feastday: 22 November

St. Cecilia's musical fame derives from her legend that she was beheaded and at the same time praised God, singing to Him, as she lay dying a martyr's death. She is often depicted playing an organ or other instrument. Music societies often have been named for her.

Her feast day became an occasion for musical concerts and festivals that occasioned well-known poems by John Dryden and Alexander Pope, and music by Henry Purcell (*Ode to St. Cecilia*), George Frideric Handel (*Ode for St. Cecilia*'s Day), Charles Gounod (*Messe Solennelle de Sainte Cecile*) and Benjamin Britten, who was born on her feast day, (*Hymn to St. Cecilia*), as well as Herbert Howells with text from a poem by W. H. Auden. Gerald Finzi's "For Saint Cecilia", Op. 30, was set to verses written by Edmund Blunden. Frederik Magle's *Cantata to Saint Cecilia* is based on the history of Cecilia.

The New York band Polar Bear Club refer to St. Cecilia in their song "Song to Persona." David Byrne and Brian Eno's song, The River, on the album, Everything that Happens Will Happen Today, also refers to St. Cecilia's Day. Paul Simon (Of Simon and Garfunkel fame) wrote the song "The Coast" which refers to a family of musicians who take refuge in the Church of St. Cecilia. Another of Paul Simon's songs was also in her honor, as "Cecilia" can be interpreted to refer to her and the frustration of song writing. English lyrics were written for a Swedish popular song "Min soldat" and released as "The Shrine of Saint Cecilia." It was recorded by a number of American groups during the 20th century like Willie Winfield and the Harp-Tones. Others were the Bon Aires and The Andrews Sisters. Stalk-Forrest group (an early incarnation of Blue Öyster Cult) recorded a song called "St. Cecilia" on their album that was released in 2003 under the title St. Cecilia: The Elektra Recordings. Then in 2007 Radioactive Records released the album (on CD and vinyl) as St. Cecilia: The California Album – Remastered.
