

DECEMBER: Advent/Christmas feasts

Feasts occur throughout December, covering most of our observance of Advent, and the start of the Christmas season.

- 6 **St. Nicholas**: Saintly Bishop of Myra (in present day Turkey); inspiration for our modern Santa Claus.
- **St. Ambrose**: Bishop and Doctor of the Church; he said: 7 "We loved them in life; let us not forget them in death."
- **Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary**
- 12 Our Lady of Guadalupe: Her Basilica outside of Mexico City is the busiest shrine of our Mother in the world.
- 13 St. Lucy: Virgin and Martyr.
- Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ: Christmas Day.
- St. Stephen: First Martyr of the New Testament. 26
- 27 St. John the Evangelist: The youngest Apostle, and the writer of the Fourth Gospel and three Epistles.
- 28 **Holy Innocents**: The youngest Martyrs for Jesus.
- 29 **St. Thomas à Beckett**: Bishop and Martyr.



The O Antiphons

During the Advent season churches everywhere ring out with the hymn "O Come, O Come Emmanuel."

The hymn is one of the oldest Advent traditions, deeply tied to the liturgy leading up to Christmas.

Throughout history the verses of the hymn were known as the "O Antiphons" or "Great Antiphons." **Father** William Saunders explains, "Boethius (c. 480-524) made a reference to them; by the 8th Century, they were used in the Roman liturgy." The use of the O Antiphons can be traced back to the very early Church.

Traditionally these verses are sung during the Liturgy of the Hours (also known as the Divine Office), and precede the recitation of the "Magnificat" (see Luke 1:46-55). **Dom Guéranger** explains in his *Liturgical Year* the symbolism of singing these verses during Evening Prayer (Vespers).

The canonical *Hour of Vespers* has been selected as the most appropriate time for this solemn supplication to our Savior, because, as the Church sings in one of her hymns, it was in the Evening of the world (*vergente mundi vespere*) that the Messiah came among us. These Antiphons are sung at the *Magnificat*, to show us that the Savior, whom we expect, is to come to us by Mary.

Each antiphon (or each verse of the hymn) is recited / sung on successive days leading up to Christmas, starting on 17 December and ending on 23 December. The antiphons are biblically based and feature a different title of the Messiah from the Old Testament.

In various monasteries they added additional antiphons, such as one to "Our Blessed Lady, *O Virgo Virginum*;" and the other to the Angel Gabriel, *O Gabriel*; or to St. Thomas the Apostle, whose feast comes during the Greater Ferias; it began *O Thoma Didyme*.

The antiphons are a beautiful way to prepare for Christmas and have always had a special place in the hearts of Christians. Following are the traditional O Antiphons and the day on which they are sung.

17 December

O WISDOM OF OUR GOD MOST HIGH, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

18 December

O LEADER OF THE HOUSE OF ISRAEL, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

19 December

O ROOT OF JESSE'S STEM, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!

20 December

O KEY OF DAVID, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

21 December

O RADIANT DAWN, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

22 December

O KING OF ALL NATIONS and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

23 December

O EMMANUEL, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!
