
## 1<sup>st</sup> Communion, Confirmation

## Church Etiquette

### **Proper Attire for Women**

Thank you for your presence here at St. Maria Goretti Church. In order to make our weekly celebrations more conducive to prayer and to preserve the sacredness of our liturgies, the following are gentle reminders of simple Church etiquette.

Please wear attire that is fitting for a Holy Place. The rules stated by the Vatican for ladies, misses and little girls are:

- O No transparent tissues and tight-fitting cuts;
- **O** Wear a dress, not trousers;
- O Skirt should cover the knees, seated or standing;
- O Low-necked dresses not lower than two finger's breadth below the base of the neck;
- O Sleeves reaching at least the elbow.





## Stage 3 Pandemic procedures

### **Ongoing Measures**

Regarding spiritual services and activities, physical distancing of two metres (6 feet) remains at this time unless members are from the same household.

By-laws remain in place requiring the use of a face mask in public spaces indoors.

A cantor may sing at Mass as long as the cantor is a minimum of three metres (ten feet) distant from anyone else.

Communion procedures are unchanged despite the lessening of restrictions in other areas. Both the person distributing communion and the communicant must be fully masked. We anticipate a return to communion on the tongue shortly but at present, communion is to distributed in the hand.

The *Sign of Peace*: A simple bow of the head toward one's neighbour may be offered in lieu of the shaking of hands.

Holy Water fonts at the entrances should not be filled yet.

The preference continues that confessions should be heard outside of the Confessional to allow for proper distancing.

Parishes should ensure they have the ability to communicate with parishioners should there be a positive COVID-19 case in their community. Sign-in sheets with contact information should be used.

#### **Relaxed Measures**

NEW - Baptisms of more than one child outside of Mass are permitted. The presider must bless the holy water in a vessel that can be poured on the candidate's head.

NEW - Pews, washrooms, confessionals, reconciliation rooms are to be cleaned in accordance with routines prior to Covid-19 restrictions.

NEW - Missals and prayer books may be replaced in pews. Please do not return hymnals to pews at this time as congregational singing is not yet permitted.

NEW - Bulletins, envelopes, pamphlets, and newspapers may again be distributed as per pre- COVID-19 practices.

NEW - Collections may again be taken up using baskets in the traditional fashion. All Ushers involved in the collection should ensure that they wear masks while undertaking this task and make every effort to ensure physical distancing of two metres (six feet).

NEW - Hand Sanitizing – it is no longer mandatory for all entering a Church to use hand sanitizer. Clergy and Ministers of Communion should continue to use hand sanitizers before and after the distribution of the Eucharist.

NEW - Altar servers may resume serving on the altar (wearing masks) and maintaining two metres (six feet) distance between each other and the priest as much as possible. Altar servers from the same household do not need to maintain physical distancing.

NEW - Children's liturgies may resume where appropriate.



## Miami Beach Parish serves as a Refuge

A Miami Beach parish provides a spiritual presence in the aftermath of the collapse of the Champlain Tower condo. **St. Joseph Catholic Church** has opened its doors to those who are grieving, welcoming Catholics and non-Catholics, as well as fire rescue personnel and journalists, for a series of prayer meetings

St. Joseph Church in Miami Beach is less than a mile from the Champlain Towers building in Surfside that collapsed on 24 June, killing over 100 people. Fr. Juan Sosa, pastor of the parish since 2010, said that they lost at least 20-25 parishioners, and the community is reeling. He said, "My role is to be a channel of communication, to be the presence of the Catholic Church in the midst of this tragedy. I am trying to take care of the church and to be as available as I can."
