


1st Communion, Confirmation







2nd Collection - 19 Sept.: Bishops' Collection for the needs of the Church in Canada

The 2nd collection on Sunday, 19 September, will be for the *Bishops' Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada*.

Every year, the Bishops of Canada appeal for financial assistance to support their work through the Collection for the *Needs of the Church in Canada*. Through the work of its members, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) is involved in national and international areas of pastoral activity, including social justice, ecumenical and interfaith relations, collaboration with Aboriginal Peoples, life and family issues, liturgy, catechesis doctrine and relations with Catholic associations and movements.

The CCCB also provides the Bishops a forum to share their experiences, insights and reflections on the major events and issues that shape the Church and modern society. It also works with the Eastern Catholic rites, such as the Byzantines and Syrians, to address needs within their communities.

The Gospel and the Election

The next Federal Election will take place on 20 September. In a homily prepared for Sunday, 5 September, the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, **Fr. Michael McGourty** of St. Peter Parish, Toronto, delivered a homily in which he emphasized the need of Catholics to vote with an informed conscience. He concluded with the following words;

When we were baptized we heard a beautiful prayer: "The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the mute speak, may he soon touch your ears to receive His word and your mouth to proclaim His word, to the praise and glory of God the Father."

That prayer points to the responsibility that we have during an election to listen with ears of faith and to speak our vote with that same faith. May each one of us do this through our faith in Christ.

May God bless Canada!




Fr. Richard Veltri 16 October 1934 – 12 September 2011

This week, St. Maria Goretti parishioners remember our dear friend, **Fr. Richard Veltri**. Born on 16 October 1934 in Port Arthur, Ontario, he initially became a teacher. While teaching in the Bahamas he met Scarboro Foreign Missionaries working



there, and decided to join the Scarboro Missions. After ordination on 5 August 1967, he was assigned to Scarboro's mission in Japan, doing parish ministry and a BA at Tokyo's Sophia University. He returned to Canada in 1974, and served in the Society's Mission Information Department, and as Secretary General to the Council. From the 1980's to the 1990's, he served the people of St. Maria Goretti Parish, as well as helping out in other parishes. In the early 1990's he received his Licentiate in Canon Law at St. Paul University, Ottawa, and served on the Marriage Tribunal of the Archdiocese of Toronto as well as doing similar work, occasionally, for the diocese of Thunder Bay. His funeral Mass was celebrated at the Scarboro Foreign Missions, and he was interred next door at Our Lady Queen of the Clergy cemetery. May he rest in peace.
