Confirmation Preparation Resource (1)

Strengthened by the Holy Spirit

The Promise of the Holy Spirit in the Scripture Readings for Christ the King Sunday.

1st Reading: 2nd Reading: Gospel:

Daniel 7.13-14 Revelation 1.5-8

John 18.33-37 Jesus said, "For this I was born, and for this I came into the world."


As we approach the culmination of the YEAR OF WORSHIP in the great FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING, our Scripture readings remind us of the promise of the Holy Spirit that awaits the faithful disciples of Christ. For instance, in the Book of Revelation, Chapter 1, we hear the Lord say, "I am the Alpha and the Omega."

In the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC), we read:

"The *imposition of hands* is rightly recognized by the Catholic tradition as the origin of the Sacrament of CONFIRMATION, which in a certain way perpetuates the grace of Pentecost in the Church" (CCC 1288).

The profound Biblical roots of the Sacrament of Confirmation allow us to reflect on its significance in our own lives, 2,000 years later.

Similarly, The Second Vatican Council says that through "the Sacrament of Confirmation, [the Baptized] are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit" (*Lumen Gentium*, 11).



With this in mind, there is comfort in knowing that through Confirmation, the Holy Spirit has strengthened us. In life, when it is difficult to persevere, or worries surrounding a pandemic or other trial weigh heavily, let us continually ask the Holy Spirit to carry us forward.

The Holy Spirit longs to dwell within all of us. Let us pray for courage among all the faithful. In particular, let us pray that the young people whose Confirmation has been postponed will have their desire for the Holy Spirit grow during this time of waiting.

To summarize: The New Testament clearly outline the Biblical roots of Confirmation, as believers received the Holy Spirit when the Apostles laid their hands on them. The Second Vatican Council said that those who receive the Sacrament "are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." When we find it difficult to persevere, or our worries weigh heavily on us, let us continually ask the Holy Spirit to carry us forward. In a special way, let us pray for the Candidates for Confirmation for whom the Sacrament has been postponed. May they grow in their desire to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, and may they practise courage during this time of waiting.

Confirmation

Guidelines for the Candidates for Confirmation in 2021, after the delay due to the pandemic

Our Parish is grateful to be able to celebrate the **Sacrament** of **Confirmation** for the St. Maria Goretti School Grade 8 students who should have received this Sacrament in the Easter Season this year, when they were in Grade 7.

The delay has made it necessary to modify some procedures.

(1) At this stage in the pandemic recovery, seating in the Church is limited by the 6-ft distancing protocol. Please respect the detailed directions you are given for your particular group regarding the number of participants you may invite.

(2) There will be NO CONFIRMATION GOWNS, so Candidates will need to wear "Sunday best," which is formal or semi-formal attire. It is suggested that **Candidates** incorporate a significant *white component* to their attire (e.g., a white shirt, blouse, dress, etc.) as a reminder of the connection between Confirmation and Baptism. It is suggested that **Sponsors** avoid clothing with garish or bold colour patterns (stripes, logos, etc.), and stick to simple, neutral colours, so that the Candidates stand out in the assembly. For men: black/grey, navy or khaki tones; for women: black/grey/white, or pastels. In the future, the photos will tell everyone that the focus of the day was on the Sacrament received at the Altar.

(3) For most groups, there cannot be any REHEARSALS, so pay close attention to the directions given at Church. To maximize seating capacity, Candidates will sit with their families and Sponsor and will be called up to the Sanctuary one family at a time via the main aisle, similar to the way we receive Communion.

(4) The CONFIRMATION CARD which each Candidate presents to the Pastor at the time they receive the Sacrament, will have to be completed upon arrival at the Church, which will be open one hour before the Mass. Candidates should arrive 45 - 30 minutes before Mass to sign in, complete their Summary forms and Confirmation cards, and then take their place in the Church with their families.

(5) If a SPONSOR is unable to be present on the assigned day, they will need to be Proxied (represented) by an adult, Confirmed Catholic. There is a special Proxy form that will need to be filled out when the family arrives at Church.

(6) Most other GUIDELINES FOR THE LITURGY remain as usual. There is *no photography during Mass* (time for posed photos will be available afterward.) This year, families will have *permission to livestream* for relatives who cannot attend, on condition that the person managing the camera remains with the family: *In the pew* during Mass, and *up to the Sanctuary* at the time of the Sacrament.

The Sponsor

The Sponsor is a fully-initiated member of the Church who:

- ✤ Represents the community; ✤ Will support the parents;
- ✤ Testifies that the Candidate will be a witness for Christ.

The original Godparent may perform this duty; or another adult who serves as an example of Christian living.

The Name

The Confirmation Name is the Christian *Baptismal* name, or the name of another *Saint* who will serve as a lifelong patron and prayer partner to the newly-confirmed.

Effects of Confirmation

The purpose of the Sacrament is the full outpouring of the Holy Spirit, as it was given to the Apostles on Pentecost.

Confirmation has several important effects:

- (1) It makes us more aware of God;
- (2) It releases the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: Wisdom, Knowledge, Counsel, Understanding, Courage, Piety and Reverence of the Lord.
- (3) It unites us more firmly to Christ;
- (4) It binds us more perfectly to the Church;
- (5) It gives us strength to spread and defend the faith by our words and actions in order to:
 - ★ be true witnesses of Christ;
 - \blacksquare confess the name of Christ boldly;
 - \blacksquare never be ashamed of the Cross.

Confirmation perfects the grace of Baptism, and imprints a permanent, indelible mark on the Christian's soul.

The Liturgy

Confirmation is ordinarily celebrated within the context of the Holy Mass. Following the Proclamation of the Word of God, the Sacrament is administered in this order:

Presentation of the Candidates Homily Renewal of Baptismal Promises Laying On of Hands¹ Anointing with Sacred Chrism²

¹ LAYING ON OF HANDS: The Bishop faces the people and introduces the prayer. Then he (and any concelebrating Priests) extend their hands over the Candidates, and ask the Father to send the Holy Spirit upon them.

² ANOINTING WITH CHRISM: Candidates walk to the Sanctuary. The Bishop goes to them individually, takes some Chrism, addresses them by their Confirmation Name, and makes the Sign of the Cross on their foreheads.

 Bishop: "______, be sealed with

 the gift of the Holy Spirit."

 Newly Confirmed: "AMEN."

 Bishop: "Peace be with you."

 Newly Confirmed: "AND WITH YOUR SPIRIT."

Here is some high-level information about The SHEPHERDS' TRUST for your interest:


In 2020, the Trust generated \$6.7 million in receipts, down 35% from 2019.

During 2020, a total of \$3.3 million was paid to 100 retired priests consisting of monthly allowances, health care premiums and extended health care costs.


The investment portfolio of the Trust performed well in 2020, consistent with stock market performance and similar to many comparable investment funds. The market disruption caused by the onset of the pandemic hurt the portfolio's investment returns earlier in 2020, but these rebounded later in the year.
