# **Consecration of Russia and Ukraine, 25 March 2022**

Pope Francis will consecrate Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary during a penitential prayer service in St. Peter Basilica on March 25. On the same day, there will be a similar consecration at the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal.

When Mary appeared to the three shepherd children in Fatima in 1917, she told them, "God wishes to establish devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If what I say to you is done, many souls will be saved, and there will be peace."

Warning of "war, famine, and persecutions of the church and of the Holy Father," Mary told the children, "to prevent this, I shall come to ask for the consecration of Russia to my Immaculate Heart."

The Eastern and Latin Rite Catholic bishops of Ukraine began asking Pope Francis for the Consecration since the Russians started their aggression in 2014 in Crimea and Eastern Ukraine. The bishops said it was "urgently needed to avoid the worsening of the war and the danger from Russia."

Since Russia invaded Ukraine on February 24, people have been showing up at the Sunday *Angelus* in St. Peter Square with signs asking the Pope for the consecration of Russia and Ukraine to Mary.

In 1917, the Fatima message promised: "If my requests are heeded, Russia will be converted, and there will be peace; if not, she will spread her errors throughout the world, causing wars and persecutions of the Church. The good will be martyred; the Holy Father will have much to suffer; various nations will be annihilated."

But, the message continued: "In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph. The Holy Father will consecrate Russia to me, and she shall be converted, and a period of peace will be granted to the world."

In our Parish, there will be a Mass in solidarity with this Consecration at 12 noon on Friday, 25 March. All who can come are welcome to attend. If you cannot be present personally, please find a time to pause at home or at work to join yourself spiritually to the prayer of Pope Francis. May God guide and protect us.

# Updates to the WorshipSafe Protocols as of 21 March 2022

\* All capacity limits, including physical distancing requirements, are removed from Churches. Distancing at Communion would remain a good practice for now.

 $\cdot$  Indoor mask use is now optional.

Holy Communion on the tongue resumed; those receiving this way should try to be at the end of the line.

The *Kiss of Peace* may be replaced by a bow or wave.

\*• Holy Water fonts are refilled.

\*•Altar Servers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion follow pre-pandemic duties.

\*••Choirs and cantors may be masked.

\*•Proof of vaccination is not a requirement to enter Archdiocese of Toronto Churches.

 $\bullet$  ·Baptisms can return to pre-pandemic practices.

\*••Confessionals can reopen; masks required.

 $\bullet$  Hand sanitization upon arrival and before the distribution of Holy Communion is encouraged.

 $\cdot$  Meetings in halls may resume, with mask use.

✤ Parishioners should be encouraged to continue selfscreening for Covid-19 symptoms and stay home if they have any symptoms.

 $\bullet$  Parishes are encouraged to review updated procedures with volunteers and others who may be assisting with the celebration of the Sacraments.

\*•Announcements at the beginning of Mass during March 2022 will note the lifting of restrictions.

# Free Tax Clinic 2 April 2022

The Catholic Women's League, in partnership with the Association of Filipino-Canadian Accountants, will be holding a FREE Tax Clinic, here at the Parish, on Saturday, 2 April: 9:30 am to 3.00 pm.

Eligible clients can have their 2021 Personal Income Tax Returns prepared for FREE.

The income thresholds are: *Single* - \$35,000; *Couples* - \$45,000.

Also, you must have a Simple Tax Situation.

If you are interested, please check with Representatives from the CWL and AFCA, who will be in the Vestibule after Mass, to provide more information.

If ELIGIBLE, please pre-register as soon as possible as only a limited number of people can be accommodated.

Specific Time slots will be assigned to tax filers. Don't forget to pre-register as soon as possible to secure your spot.







Monastery of Sumela

(*Photo immediately above*:) Complaints by Christians over the ancient Monastery of Sumela in northeastern Turkey being used as a disco for an electronic music video have led to the government opening an investigation. The Orthodox monastery, dedicated to the Virgin Mary, is located in the province of Trabzon. The Turkish Ministry of Culture and Tourism puts its foundation date around AD 386, in the reign of the emperor Theodosius I (375 - 395). Many thousands of Orthodox Christian worship at the monastery annually.

"May the Lord preserve the Russian land, a land which now includes Russia and Ukraine and Belarus and other tribes and peoples." A Sunday sermon with very political overtones. It was delivered 27 February at the Cathedral of Christ the Savior in Moscow by Patriarch Kirill, head of the Russian Orthodox Church. The 75year-old patriarch castigated those who fight against the historical unity of Russia and Ukraine, calling them "*evil forces*." "Protect our common historical homeland. God forbid that the present political situation in fraternal Ukraine, so close to us, should be aimed at making the evil forces that have always strived against the unity of Rus' and the Russian Church, gain the upper hand," he said. Rus' was a medieval state, where today are situated Russia, Ukraine and Belarus.
